Maya Angelou, a famous African-American author, said, "It is time for parents to teach young people early on that in diversity there is beauty and there is strength."

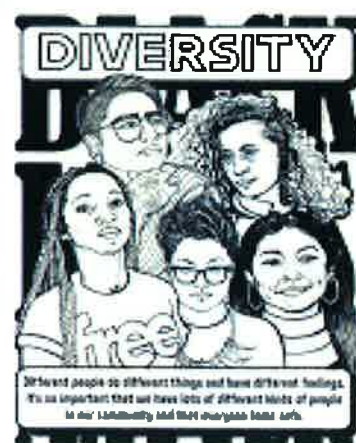
We know there is an explicit link between the vast majority of the Black, Asian minority ethnic (BAME) communities' complex social-economic issues and racial injustice which also includes healthcare and in 2020 the disproportionate numbers of the BAME community being at a higher risk of being infected with coronavirus or sadly dying from it.

The facts speak for themselves, we know in the UK applicants from BAME communities are less likely to receive offers from the most selective universities, even when they may have the same grades as their white counterparts. Also BAME groups are more likely to be at the lower end of the pay scale, passed over for promotion, 10 times more likely to be stopped and searched by the police, 4 times likely to be detained under the Mental Health Act, twice as likely to be fined during lockdown and 4 times more likely than white people in Britain to be in prison, the list goes on and on and we have to ask ourselves why is that?

We believe that education is a vital tool in the fight for racial equality and will make the difference to change in this world. As the world rightly recognises the struggles the BAME community continues to face, we're determined to step forward and shout out our support for Black Lives Matter in the fight for racial equality.
